REPORT FROM YOUR LOCAL PCSO

A lot of my work as a PCSO revolves around organising and running campaigns and events to educate and inform school children, about matters related to their wellbeing and safety.

Last year we launched a road safety poster competition at Pembury Primary School to highlight the importance of wearing a seatbelt. The posters had to be completed by pupils at home and the lucky winners have recently been chosen and will be receiving prizes from Pembury Tesco and the Bowlplex in Tunbridge Wells. With the current financial climate that we're all experiencing, it's also encouraging to see local businesses supporting the community.

I recently planned a security bike marking event which took place in February.

Remember, having your bike security marked not only deters thieves but it greatly increases the chances of having stolen or lost property retuned to you.

In other matters, we have recently had to deal with complaints about a tenant of a housing association property in Belfield Road, who continuously caused anti-social behaviour and attracted unwanted visitors to the area. This not only caused misery to neighbours in the area, but placed significant demands on police time as well as our partners.

Unfortunately as some of you may know, there is not always an immediate solution to issues involving problem tenants.

However, with the help of local residents, who have continuously supported police, I'm pleased to report that this particularly troublesome individual has now been moved out of the area. The quality of life for those living nearby has now hopefully improved.

The above matter actually demonstrates how crucial it often is to work closely with our partners to help resolve issues which impact on our communities.

Indeed, much of what is perceived to be police work is often led by other organisations, such as local authorities, Kent Trading Standards, the RSPCA, Crime Stoppers and Action Fraud.

Together we work effectively to combat crime and deal with a diverse range of issues that often have far reaching consequences for many people.

Finally, a reminder to those of you who have access to the internet that the Kent Police website offers lots of crime prevention advice, as well as information on protecting yourself from fraud and the latest scams, policing news and appeals regarding recent incidents.

PLAYING BOWLS IN PEMBURY

The essence of the game of bowls is that a jack, which is a white or yellow hard ball, slightly smaller than a tennis ball, is placed on the playing surface at varying lengths away from the players, who then roll their bowls along the playing surface intending that one or more of their bowls is closer to the jack than those of their opponents. The difficulty in the game results from the shape of the bowls which are made with a bias and will follow a curved path away from the biased side. The skill of the game therefore is to determine how wide of the jack should the bowl be delivered and with what effort. However, playing surfaces vary considerably and these variations also influence the path of the bowls.

Two forms of the game of bowls are available in our village – lawn bowls in summer and short mat bowls in winter. Both forms provide the opportunity for gentle exercise, friendly competition, the development and improvement of playing skills, and the opportunity to make or renew friendships within the Pembury clubs and with bowlers from other clubs, villages and towns. These opportunities are open to most ages of men and women and boys and girls, who will normally play alongside one another in mixed teams and competitions, although there are some gender specific competitions and leagues.

Pembury Bowls Club provides facilities for the summer game at their bowling green and clubhouse next to the car park in the Lower Green Road Recreation Ground. The playing season extends from the last week in April to the penultimate week in September. A core activity of the club is the playing of mixed friendly matches with other clubs from local villages and towns. These take place on most Saturday and Sunday afternoons, some played at home and some played away, and halfway through each match the players break for a light tea. Teams normally contain 12 players and members of all abilities are encouraged to play in these matches. On a more competitive basis the club runs an internal league each Monday evening with teams open to all members; it enters teams in the local Tunbridge Wells Ladies and Men's Leagues and runs various internal competitions to establish club champions. Members also use the green outside of these events to practise or to play against each other.

The club also holds a number of social evenings which include a barbecue, two quiz nights, a prize giving dinner and a Christmas dinner.

Pembury Short Mat Bowls Club provides facilities for the winter game in Pembury Village Hall, using four carpets (mats) which are 15 yards long and 2 yards wide, on which the game is played. Each mat replicates a shortened lane on a bowling green and allows members to play a similar game to that played outdoors. One difference, however, is that a block of wood some 12 inches long and 3 x 3 inches square is placed across the centre point of each mat. (7½ yards from each end). This block must not be touched by a bowl and ensures that players use the bias of their bowl to bypass it rather than to propel their bowl at speed straight down the middle of the (comparatively short) mat.



The club meets on Thursday afternoons between 2.00pm and 4.30pm during the winter season which this year extends until April 21st. The core activity of members at these sessions is the playing of friendly games, usually in teams of 2, 3 or 4 players with each team being drawn by ballot. This ensures that players of all abilities play together and help one another, allowing players of lesser experience to benefit by playing with or against more experienced players, and vice versa. Play stops halfway through each session for everyone to have a cup of tea and a biscuit. Then teams are redrawn for the second half. The club also plays on two alternate Tuesday afternoons each month, at which league matches may take place, which are



also available for play by non-league playing club members. The club also arranges friendly matches against several other local clubs and for the more competitively-minded members holds four internal cup competitions each season and enters teams into three divisions of the local league. All these activities are mixed and not limited by gender or age.

PLAYING BOWLS IN PEMBURY CONT...

Both clubs welcome new members. Pembury Bowls Club has an annual fee of £75 but normally applies a substantial discount to this for the first season's membership. Pembury Short Mat Bowls Club has an annual fee of £10 but also makes a charge of £2 per session per player to cover the cost of the hall hire and refreshments. Both clubs will normally allow potential new members to try the game free of charge for one or two sessions. OWLSNEST

There is a planning application to develop Owlsnest as a 76 bed care home, opposite Pembury Hospital. The Patient Group for Waterfield House met the developers of the Owlsnest site on 2nd February and expressed their concerns that the additional burden of another care home to be looked after by the surgery will drain resources. This will result in the service being provided by our GPs being greatly reduced as they already have more people in care homes than other West Kent practices, but receive no additional funding to cover the costs.

As a result the developer's representatives said that they would consider a way of funding a GP for the care home in a way that will ensure the care home residents will never impact on the provision of healthcare to the wider population of Pembury. We are anxious that this issue is resolved before any planning permission is granted.

May I bring to your attention a Smart Phone application that has been running for some time now, Country Eye? As you may be aware Country Eye in one guise or another has been running for a long time and has assisted Kent Police on a number of occasions. This new app means we can get live data/ information in regards to a number of issues that affect the safety of the public and as such it is of massive interest to us. By using this app to post pictures of fly tipping, for example, it will be directed appropriately, to the Borough Council, rather than to the 101 Kent Police switchboard and it therefore allows us to focus our time on other matters you have made us aware of. It can also help by sharing details of suspicious vehicles, persons, events, etc. Pictures of suspects and vehicles give us a fantastic starting point for investigating crime and increase our chances of apprehending offenders.



MONEY MATTERS

January can be a difficult time for a lot of us when trying to work out how to pay off the cost of Christmas. Often the problem is associated with difficulties in working out a budget and sticking to it. The Citizens Advice public website has a simple budgeting tool which helps you do this; see https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money/help-with-debt/budgeting/budgeting-tool/ for details of how to use it.



The first step is to make a list of what your regular expenses are. It is important to be realistic and put everything down so that you can assess whether there are any expenses which you can cut back on temporarily while you sort your finances out. Don't forget those expenses which only happen once a year such as car insurance, road tax, household insurance or TV Licence.

As well as being a useful way of working out what you are spending and how much you have to spare, a budget helps you negotiate with anybody you owe money to if you are having difficulty paying any bills. Remember that some bills are more important than others – this relates to what the consequences are of not paying them: such as possible eviction for rent arrears if you don't pay your rent, a fine if you don't pay your television licence and disconnection if you don't pay gas or electricity.

PEMBURY U3A

I am often asked 'What is U3A?' So this is my opportunity to explain its purpose and what our members do. The 'U' stands for 'university' but we are not a higher educational establishment and the '3A' means Third Age but there is no minimum age requirement. Instead our U3A is for anyone no longer in full time employment or no longer having full time parental care responsibilities (that is in the third stage of life) and who wants to take part in the educational, creative and leisure activities provided or organised by our members.

Our village U3A is one of nearly 1000 U3As throughout the UK. We are a registered charity with no religious or political affiliations. Later this year we will be celebrating our 10th anniversary. How things have changed since the inaugural meeting of a handful of interested people in October 2006 as we now have nearly 300 members!

What do we do? We are a self help organisation run by volunteer members and there are essentially three types of activity. The first is provided by our Interest Groups led by members who have skills, experience or knowledge they want to share with others. Pembury U3A is blessed with many members who have that desire – so much so that we now have over 50 different Interest Groups. These cover a wide range of subjects. Here are just a few examples -Computing, Italian, Ukulele, Woodcarving, Digital Photography, Painting for Fun, Play Reading, Line Dancing. So if a member wants to brush up on a subject they loved in the past but had no time to pursue it in their working career or if a member just wants to learn something new, there is at least one Interest Group which should appeal. The approach of every Interest Group is 'Learning for Pleasure' with no pressure to achieve any qualification.

The second activity consists of our monthly meetings held in the Village Hall on the first Tuesday of most months. This is the opportunity for members to meet up to hear what is going on and have a cup of tea or coffee after they have heard a talk or presentation from a guest speaker. These can be on any subject of general interest. For example in the past year, we have had talks on Joyce Grenfell, Homeopathy, Gilbert & Sullivan, Antiques and the European Union; in the months ahead we will welcome speakers on an Owl Sanctuary, Nelson, and Working in Zambia. In addition we also hold

lecture lunches two or three times a year in a smaller venue; these tend to feature more serious subjects – for example the next lecture lunch will focus on the state of the NHS.





Third and last (and certainly not least) are the social events organised by and for members. It includes such things as excursions, visits to the theatre or opera, holidays, garden parties, Christmas Lunch and a summer BBQ. Coming up this year three trips have already been arranged - to theatres in Canterbury and London during March and April, day trips to Arundel and Faversham in April and October and a holiday in Northumberland in October.

What is common to all these activities is that they provide a friendly, sociable environment for all participants - and can be lots of fun too!



SUNDAY REFUSE COLLECTION

For many years Tunbridge Wells Borough Council funded a Sunday refuse collection at three points in the village. Last year, the Parish Council was informed that funding would be withdrawn for this service and if the village wanted to continue with the collections it would have to fund them. Due to the usefulness of this service to parishioners and the fear that not to have it would increase fly tipping in the countryside, the Parish Council took the decision to fund it from the parish precept at a cost of £814 per annum.



PEMBURY CONSERVATION GROUP

Our group, which meets every Thursday, (and very rarely does the weather stop us) gets a great deal of satisfaction keeping the footpaths around the village clear and free from obstruction and in some instances working with the land owners and KCC for the supply of some of the materials, ie, stiles and railway sleepers to rebuild or make new bridges etc.



This picture is of one of the new footways we have just constructed where footpath WT193 meets footpath WT204. This is constructed of four railway sleepers with a mesh covering to prevent slipping. The ditch that it covered was an area that in wet conditions became very swamp like and walkers had been throwing bits of tree branch in to walk across but this only made it worse. The hardest bit was carrying the heavy sleepers across the wet fields to get there.

We now come to a disaster zone. At the entrance to footpath WT247 just above the Old Mill House is mess that can only be described as a

disaster and a disgrace. Not only has it been the subject of fly tipping, some of which is now finding its way down to the stream but also a large amount of concrete blocks have been dumped there as if they were to be laid down for tracks to enable some sort of vehicle to be moved up and down the path; the last time I looked there was an old dump truck abandoned up in the wood. Unfortunately, this area of woodland has always been part of the beautiful Bluebell walks around the village and very often walked by walkers from other villages.





If the rubbish is on private ground the KCC can do very little about it but a message to the Environmental Department at the Borough Council Offices would do no harm. However, if the rubbish is on and or damaging the Public Footpath then the KCC can take action. If you get the chance go and have look then call the KCC, after all it's our village and our environment.

The girls participated in the service with readings and prayers and each group performed their own version of a traditional carol.



GROVEHURST

I thought that I had read all the information regarding Grovehurst but right out of the blue I received a message from Rosemary Ford via her daughter Lindsey, regarding her late father's employment there. Rosemary was born in the village and went to Pembury School. She married Keith Ford, probably one of the most skilled footballers to play for Pembury and they had two children, Lindsey and Martin. In later years they moved to the West Country. Sadly Keith is no longer with us.

Rosemary's father's name was John (Jack) Taverner and he was probably Pembury FC's most ardent supporter. Rosemary states that her father was a gardener at Grovehurst in the late 20s and early 30s when there were at least ten gardeners employed there along with a large number of domestic staff. At that time the house belonged to a Mr Morton, of Morton's Tinned Peas. Rosemary thinks the firm was sold many years ago but it made Mr Morton a millionaire, as were many of the owners of large houses in Pembury Road, eg, Sherwood Park

and Dunorlan and Jack always referred to it as Millionaire's Row.

Cornford House, the large house in Cornford Lane, was built by Mr Morton as a wedding present for his daughter and it then became a home for retired missionaries. Rosemary adds that in all her life at home they had a very nice credenza 'posh sideboard' which originally came from Grovehurst. One of Jack's favourite stories about his time at Grovehurst gives a flavour of the political attitudes of the landed gentry in those days. A general election was imminent and Mr Morton gathered the outside staff together and informed them that if the Tories didn't win he might be forced to 'decrease the staff considerably' which many of the men believed and no persuasion from Jack would convince them to vote otherwise.

Many thanks for this information Rosemary and I know that all those who remember you and your family wish you well.

RECIPES

BRAISED LAMB SHANKS WITH CANNELLINI BEANS - SERVES 6

3 tbsp. olive oil 6 lamb shanks 3 celery sticks 2 x 400g cans tomatoes

2 bay leaves Salt and ground black pepper 1 large onion (chopped)

3 carrots (sliced)

2 garlic cloves (crushed)

4 fl oz balsamic vinegar

2 x 400g tins cannellini beans (drained and rinsed)

- 1. Preheat oven to 170° (150° fan) gas mark 3
- 2. Heat oil in a flameproof casserole dish and brown the lamb shanks all over. Set aside on a plate
- Add the onion, carrots, celery and garlic to the casserole and cook until softened
- 4. Return the lamb to the casserole and add the chopped tomatoes and balsamic vinegar and stir. Season with salt and pepper and add bay leaves
- 5. Cover and simmer for about 5 minutes
- 6. Transfer to the oven and cook for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours
- 7. Remove from the oven and add cannellini beans. Cover and return to oven for another ½ hour
- 8. Serve with mashed potatoes and vegetables

GYPSY TART

200g plain flour
1 small can evaporated milk
100g margarine
60z light muscovado sugar
Icing sugar and cocoa powder for dusting



- 1. Heat oven to 200° (190° fan) gas mark 6
- Rub the margarine into the flour until it is like breadcrumbs. Mix in a little water and mix to form a dough
- 3. On a lightly floured surface roll out the dough and line a 20cm flan tin. Prick all over with a fork and bake for about 20 minutes
- 4. Using an electric mixer whisk together sugar and evaporated milk
- 5. After about 10 minutes the mixture should be thickened and pale
- 6. Pour into the pastry case and return to the oven for 10 minutes
- 7. Remove from oven and allow to cool. Dust with icing sugar and cocoa powder
