UNVEILING OF THE MEMORIAL BENCH TO THE LATE KEVIN LYNES

He now leads his happy band of artisans who are all competent furniture makers in their own right - one also makes beautiful rocking horses and hobby ponies for children and not so little children!

All their benches are individually hand crafted in their workshop in Great Hockham ~ not just picked off a shelf ~ to client's exact (and often exacting) requirements (!)

All the wood is English oak which is grown and harvested at Ickworth House - a National Trust property in Suffolk. As part of its commitment towards a sustainable environment, the National Trust undertake to plant an oak tree for every order received. In that way they can rest assured that they will benefit our environment & yet still produce timber for the next generation. We are very proud of the fact that we have already had planted well over a 3500 trees since the scheme started & now feel we have been able to "put something back".

I have decided it would be nice to revive this series of articles which ran from Spring 2001 until Autumn 2011, and featured some 30 people in the Village.

GORDON LAVY

At the beginning of March I spent a lovely couple of hours over a cup of tea talking to Gordon Lavy. We chatted about his interesting life and career, which I now have the pleasure of sharing with you. Gordon and his lovely wife Pat have lived in the Village since 2002. They have seven children and twenty-three grandchildren, not to mention Boris their miniature Schnauzer!

Gordon was born in 1924 in Nablus, a Palestinian City some twenty miles north of Jerusalem. Gordon's father had been ordained at Cambridge before going out to the Middle East. However, he decided medicine would be a more suited career



for himself. Having qualified as a doctor in Dublin he then returned to India, where he sadly lost his first wife and new-born son. After some years he married again in Sudan. Gordon's parents were members of the Church Missionary Society and they moved to Palestine.

Gordon attended Emmanuel College, Cambridge having decided he would also like to follow in his father's footsteps by pursuing a medical career. Around the time he was due to start his two years National Service, he answered an advert appealing for doctors in the New Zealand Navy. His fellow medical students had all been called up in batches and joined the army. So, instead of serving two years in the army, Gordon sailed to New Zealand with another student from Glasgow. They spent six months in various hospitals in New Zealand.

The Korean War (1950-53) started whilst he was in New Zealand and they were one of the first nations to respond with support. Gordon spent a year with a New Zealand unit on a naval frigate as a Medical Officer. His unit was based in Japan at the naval base of Sasebo.

After serving a further few months with the New Zealand Navy, Gordon returned home having spent three years in New Zealand. His ambition was to be a house surgeon or registrar. He spent time in various local practices as a locum before taking his exams which resulted in him qualifying as a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (F.R.C.S.).

Gordon then met Pat, who was at the time nursing at St. Bartholomew's Hospital (Barts). Unbeknown to Gordon they had both been at Barts before he went to New Zealand. Gordon and Pat were married in Hastings in 1955.

As Christians they felt they would like to devote their time to something useful and decided to go abroad. Gordon applied to go to East Africa with the Colonial Service. A vacancy came up with a Ugandan Mission Hospital called Mengo in Kampala. The Hospital was opened in 1897 as the first Mission Hospital in East Africa. Gordon and Pat ended up spending six years in Uganda. They decided to return to the United Kingdom to enable their six children to continue their education. Gordon accepted a position as Senior Registrar at Aberdeen Royal Infirmary.

In 1967 Gordon was appointed as a Surgeon at Pembury Hospital and they lived in Camden Park, Tunbridge Wells. Gordon was also Honorary Consultant to Burrswood Hospital in Groombridge. In 1987 after living for twenty years in Tunbridge Wells, Gordon, Pat and their family decided to move to Pembury to the old Vicarage, which they renamed "Copsley". In 2002 after Gordon retired and most of the family had flown the

nest, they decided to move to their present house in Lower Green Road, with lovely views over the village green.

Gordon and Pat still attend St. Peter's Church in Tunbridge Wells, where Gordon continued as a lay reader, a role he had enjoyed in Uganda. The family are their main interest now, with 4 sons, 3 daughters and all those grandchildren. One daughter, Harriet, lives in the village and the rest of the family are scattered around the country. Three of their sons are surgeons and two daughters are nurses, following in their parents footsteps.

Both Gordon and Pat enjoy visiting their cottage near

Wroxham, Norfolk, which they acquired after enjoying caravan holidays. They have been going there over a twenty

year period. Gordon says how important it is to keep active. He enjoys walking to the Community Coffee Shop on a Monday, the Village Market on a Tuesday and the Church Coffee Mornings on a Wednesday. They also enjoy taking an active interest as members of the Pembury Society. Gordon tells me he would like to go and watch the cricket in the summer, but never seems to get around to it. He watches the Bowls occasionally and used to go bowling himself.

Gordon and Pat celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary with their family at the Spa Hotel in September 2015. They like to be involved in village life and enjoy Pembury. They are living proof of the old adage: "Do a little good in the world and it will do you the world of good."

KENT POLICE

A greater number of victims of domestic abuse are now reporting offences to police than before. High profile media stories have seen an increase in the reporting of historic sexual offences, which has helped drive public awareness and confidence to report other incidents to police, including domestic abuse cases. Our officers are



bringing more offenders to justice and we are continuing to encourage more people to report any incidents of domestic violence. As confidence continues to increase in reporting offences these figures are expected to carry on rising.

Violence in public places in the Tunbridge Wells district, including Pembury, has generally been decreasing as have the number of reported burglaries, incidents of criminal damage and reports of antisocial behaviour. As a district Tunbridge Wells has the lowest levels of reported crime in the county and officers will continue to work relentlessly to ensure it remains this way.

It is important to also note that a more vigorous approach to recording crime, which has been recognised and acknowledged by HMIC, has seen a real focus on recording all offences reported during an incident as separate crimes. This has had a sizeable impact on all violence and sexual offences.

Kent Police is now recording 96 per cent of crimes accurately and HMIC stated in a November report last year about Crime Data Integrity, that the people of Kent can have confidence in the force's crime figures.



HAPPY 90TH MA'AM

Given the amount of recent media coverage I'm sure you can't have missed the fact that this year is the Queen's 90th birthday!

Born on the 21st April, 1926 she was the eldest child of The Duke and Duchess of York. In 1936, when her grandfather, King George V died, her uncle came to the throne as King Edward VIII. Before the end of the year, King Edward VIII abdicated and Princess Elizabeth's father acceded to the throne as King George VI. On the death of her father George VI in 1952, Princess Elizabeth became Queen at the age of 25.

She is now the longest and the oldest UK reigning monarch in British history – her closest rival being Queen Victoria. She can also lay claim to being the longest reigning female monarch in world history!

As well as her actual birthday, the Queen is lucky enough to have an official birthday. This year it falls on Saturday 11th June and Pembury is doing its best to mark the occasion. 'Hope' Churches Together has organised a Fun Day in the Recreation Ground on Saturday 11 June at 2.00pm and St Peter's Church is holding a vintage tea party on the green in front of the church on Sunday 12th June at 2.30pm - 5.30pm. Pembury's Royal Claims to Fame

Given that this is a celebratory year for the Queen, we've done a bit of digging to see if Pembury has any queenly or royal connections and this is what we found:

- Sophie, Countess of Wessex, was raised in in Brenchley and according to Wikipedia she attended Kent College, Pembury, before training as a secretary at West Kent College, Tonbridge.
- One of our councillors was 'reliably' informed by the Manor House gardener back in 1983, that
 Queen Victoria once stopped off for a loo break at the Camden Arms on her way to Hastings! We've
 found no corroborating evidence to support this so if anyone has anything more to add on the
 subject we would be very interested to hear from them.
- Kathryn Franklin from the Pembury Society has been researching local history for over 30 years, and
 although she's found nothing queenly, she does know that in 1297 Edward 1 went on a perambulation
 (as royalty did in those days) taking three weeks to travel from Westminster to Udimore and on the
 way spent one night in Pembury, at Bayhall, as the guest of the Culpepper family.

Finally, a Pembury resident with a bona fide, first-hand connection to the Queen – or Princess Elizabeth as she was then.

Richard Hinder met Princess Elizabeth in 1951. He presented her with a book at an international cookery competition at Grosvenor House Hotel in front of 1,500 people. He said "I was 11 years old at the time and spent the previous week practising my bowing in front of my mother." He was rewarded with a big smile from the Princess – no doubt down to his bowing expertise!

And Mr Hinder will never forget exactly what date it was – 10th July 1951. The day Randy Turpin beat Sugar Ray Robinson in the boxing ring – so all in all it was a pretty good day for an 11 year old boy.

FALL OF A GIANT



I suspect that, like myself, there are many people in this Parish who love trees and feel a degree of sadness when a huge tree comes down either as a result of storm conditions or it has to be felled because it has become dangerous. Unfortunately this was the case with what was probably one of the tallest oak trees in the Parish, which was situated at the rear of the Old Church on the border with Kent College.

I don't know how many of you had seen this tree but it was very tall - over one hundred feet - and was not bushy like many Oaks but consisted of two massive spurs which branched out about five feet above ground level. We try and keep an eye on any tree which is close to public areas, footpaths, play areas etc. Following the high winds at Easter visible damage to the tree could be seen but thankfully the eagle eye of the tree surgeon picked out the crack which had developed right in the centre of the spur. Within a week that split had developed further and the Parish Council had no other option than to order its felling.

Had the tree split it would have demolished the Old Church and possibly caused the death or injury of anyone inside the Church or within the grounds. The other half would have fallen into the grounds of Kent College causing unknown damage. The tree has been left as a monolith for historic and wildlife reasons. Please see the photos by my good friends Melvyn Cole and Barbara Russell showing the tree, the Church and the crack which would have split the tree in two. It is estimated that the tree was at least 200 years old. Just think of what has happened in the world during its lifetime.

Each of the three winners will receive a "What on Earth?" Wallbook Timeline of British History









PENSION SCAMS

Falling victim to a pension scam can be devastating. Following years of saving, consumers can be conned out of all their private retirement income. What could have been a comfortable retirement becomes twilight years of impoverishment.

citizens advice

Recent introduction of Government's pension freedoms – in which savers have more scope to invest or spend their pension pots how they like – means that over 55s are being particularly targeted by scammers. These tricksters offer a range of fake and fraudulent pension opportunities and plans.

Citizens Advice has found that three distinct scams are emerging:

- High rate return investments: offering unrealistically high rates of return. Investors rarely see any of their money back
- Free pension reviews: where people are badgered into 'a free pension review'. A visiting
 salesperson then convinces the pension pot holder to sign documents which in effect
 give scammers full access to their funds
- Investments for pension cash: where people are advised to invest in such as overseas
 property or fine wines. These investments don't actually exist and savings are lost.

As consumers struggle to identify if a pension offer is genuine or a scam, it is increasingly important they know where to go for support. It is unwise to rely on informal sources of help such as a website or family and friends. These sources cannot necessarily be relied upon to spot a scam.

Beyond individual cases of hardship, there are also risks to the wider pension system and confidence in responsible financial advisers. More than a third of Citizens Advice staff think the threat of pension scams is reducing their clients' level of trust in the broader pensions system. Negative stories or experiences of pensions and broader financial services can affect consumers' attitudes to pensions for many years, with impacts on saving levels, investment choices and use of financial advice.

BALSAMIC ROASTED SAUSAGES WITH RED VEGETABLES - SERVES 4

3 Red Onions cut into wedges 3 Red Peppers deseeded and cut into quarters

2 tbsp Olive Oil

8 sausages 250g/9oz Cherry Tomatoes 1 tbsp Clear Honey 2 tbsp Balsamic Vinegar

- 1. Heat oven to 200°C/180°C fan/gas mark 6. Put the onions and peppers in a roasting tin, drizzle with olive oil and vinegar and season. Roast for about 10 minutes.
- 2. Add the sausages, tomatoes to the vegetables and drizzle the honey over and cook for 25 minutes, turning the sausages halfway until cooked.
- 3. Serve with potatoes or crusty bread

4oz Self Raising Flour6oz Caster Sugar2 tbsp Cocoa Powder4floz Milk

1 tspn Vanilla Essence 1oz Margarine – melted 4oz Soft Brown Sugar 1oz Cocoa Powder – sifted

34 pint hot water



- 1. Heat oven to 180°C/160°F/gas mark 4. Mix together the flour, caster sugar, a pinch of salt and 2 tbsp cocoa powder
- 2. Stir in the milk, vanilla essence and margarine and pour into a 2 ½ pint greased dish
- 3. Sprinkle the mixture with the sifted cocoa powder and brown sugar
- 4. Pour over the hot water
- 5. Bake for about 40-50 minutes.
- 6. Serve with cream or ice cream

UPDATE ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF PENN'S YARD, PEMBURY, KENT, TN2 4XY – As of May 2016

As you can see from the picture the scheme is in its final stages of completion and progress has been very efficient to date.

The final phase of works includes decorations and snagging and also the completion of groundworks and all externals including gardens, the play area and car parking spaces.

The development will feature a mixture of 11 flats and houses for shared ownership for people in the local area, with the remaining 16 for affordable rent, including one house which is fully wheelchair accessible.

The estimated handover date from Chartway Group to Town and Country Housing Group is currently July 2016 and will be known as 1 – 27 Chestnut Walk.

CRIME REPORT

Here we are again, second quarter of the year already. Please accept my apologies for the lack of crime figures for the previous quarter but this was due to a technical hitch.

However I have been assured by the Police that Pembury is still a very safe place to live but where domestic violence has been part of the picture.

Let's now look at the figures for Jan, Feb and Mar 2016. What an encouraging change. The total reported crime figure for the quarter is 37 and I would have to go back a long way to find one as low as that and all I can say is let's do all we can to do it again. It is encouraging to see that burglary from dwellings was down to two and other types of burglary were also two; perhaps this is as a result of people taking more precautions with their property.

Violent crime has fallen to 15 which again is encouraging. Bearing in mind the previous

figure was 27. Please remember violent crime covers a wide range of crime and does not always result in injury.

The figure was made up as follows: Assault occasioning actual bodily harm 6, Common Assault (battery without injury) 6, Malicious Communications 1, Violent Disorder 1 and Sexual Assault 1. Please remember that often assaults do not result in injury and that nine of these assaults were domestic.

It is good news for Pembury at the moment so let's do all we can to keep it that way by giving the Police all the support we can to help prevent crime and let's prove to the would-be criminal that it really does not pay.
