- **3. DRAFT UNAUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR 2022/2023.** Unaudited accounts for 2023/2023 were noted.
- **4. OPEN FORUM.** Various guestions were raised and included the following:
 - Which bus shelter locations were to have seating installed?

Top of Woodhill Park, High Street (near Cornford Park), High Street (opposite the Camden), Lower Green Road (next to the junction with Beagleswood), Bo-Peep stop (opposite number 155 Hastings Road) and the King Will stop (opposite the Indian restaurant in Hastings Road).

What could be done about speeding in the village?

It was explained that Automatic Traffic Count surveys had been carried out and data showed that speeding wasn't too much of an issue although everyone acknowledged that it happened.

Speedwatch had been set up and deployed and if anyone wished to suggest a location, they were encouraged to contact Borough Cllr Roberts.

- Clarification was requested about the level of reserves and an explanation given.
- Could there be more litter picks?

This would be considered and Borough/County Cllr Barrington King offered to financially support these.

Could something be done about poor drainage in the village?

This issue needed to be reported to Kent County Council (KCC).
