NATURE NOTES

Well finally some sort of spring-like weather has arrived. Even if the rain seems to be continuing for ever. It's an interesting point to note that if you walk on many of the paths in any of the local woodland, especially where there is some sort of slope you can see the tree roots preventing a lot of erosion by holding the soil/mud in place. This is actually quite a vital benefit of woodland, and negative erosive effects can be seen on a large scale in Africa and America where woodland or forest has been cleared.



The spring bird visitors have been turning up in encouraging numbers in Snipe and Bassett Wood and Stonecourt Old Orchard. I'm pleased to see increased numbers of Blackcaps and Whitethroats – varieties of migrant warbler, with slightly rarer Garden and Wood Warbler making a much appreciated appearance. It's quite incredible to see the continued rewilding of much of the area and how quickly it can transform back to how nature intended. All local birds are clearly busy nesting at the moment, please take care whilst out if you do come across a nest.



There is also more deer activity around many of the footpaths. One of the advantages of the heavy mud everywhere is that it shows the cloven hoof prints of the local Roe Deer up very well, and there clearly is a lot of activity, mostly nocturnal but I have spied a couple of hinds peering at me through the trees in the last couple of weeks.

The wet spring has slowed down the butterfly hatches with only the odd peacock, holly blue, red admiral and brimstone noted so far.

This brings me on to Big Green Week, which takes place nationally 8^{th} – 16^{th} June. We have managed to secure a speaker on Climate change from Sussex University who we hope will be speaking at the Recreation Ground Pavilion – further details to follow. Hopefully I will be able to conduct a guided bird and wildlife tour through local woods, together with a staff member from the High Weald Trust during that week. Again, further details to follow, although by the time you read this full information will be on the Parish Council website and social media. The main feature is for individuals to try and do something themselves to help towards increasing habitat and improving biodiversity through their own actions. Please let us know what you do.


CHAIR'S REPORT

Although we are heading into longer





We had our first Litter Pick of the year on the 23rd of March, and were very lucky to not only have a great turn out, but dry if not blustery weather! We met at the Village Green at 10.30 to pick up rubbish bags, litter pickers and hi-vis vests kindly supplied by We Waste. Then, thanks to an organised man with a clipboard (or Jon as we call him...) volunteers were despatched to all 4 corners of the village.

The amount of litter collected was sadly, but not surprisingly astonishing. As you can see from the picture we managed to collect a Tesco trolley, a garden bucket, and about 40 bags of rubbish. After returning with their collections, the volunteers were treated to a fabulous burger, fruit and refreshments by the Rapid Relief Team.

We are very grateful to all the volunteers who litter picked, and who themselves were also thanked by members of the public that saw them doing it – so hopefully more volunteers next time....

The next two litter picks are both at 10.30 and on Saturday 15th June to coincide with Big Green week running from 8th – 16th June, and Saturday 28th September. We have requested more hi-vis vests, and children's litter pickers as there seemed a need.... We aim to also have collection points at the Baptist Church and Tesco, so those that volunteer to do the bottom end of the village and down by the Hospital area don't have to come all the way to the green to collect! These will also be drop off points for rubbish, but the burgers and refreshments will still be on the green....

A huge thank you to We Waste for supplying all the equipment and more importantly taking the rubbish away, and to the Rapid Relief Team for their fantastic catering.








AA MILITARY ROAD RUN -2024

A good crowd turned out to watch this year's Run from Sevenoaks to Hastings. 71 privately owned historic military vehicles and veteran, vintage and classic cars entered the event. 67 took to the road from Sevenoaks (one on tow from the AA, who managed to get him back on the road in Hastings). RECIPES



Berengina Rellena (I think)!

I had this in a tapas bar in Madrid in May and it was absolutely delicious. I asked the waiter if I could have the recipe so he called the owner over. He didn't speak English and my Spanish is limited to 2 gin and tonics please, so the conversation was hilarious. In the end I decided that I knew roughly what was in it so here goes.

- Recipe Serves 4.
- 2 large aubergines.
- 1lb minced pork/beef
- 1 large onion sliced
- 2/3 ounces chopped mushrooms.
- 2 cloves garlic.
- 1 green pepper chopped.
- Tin pulped tomatoes
- Cheese

Slice the aubergines in half lengthways and make diagonal cuts along them being careful not to break the skin. Drizzle with olive oil, season with salt and black pepper and bake in a medium oven fo 45 minutes to an hour or until the flesh of the aubergine is soft enough to scoop out.


Meanwhile fry the onions, garlic and pepper for about 10 minutes not letting the onions brown then tip in the tomatoes reserving a quarter of the tin. Add the meat and continue until it's cooked through. Remove the aubergines from the oven and let them cool for 10/15 minutes. Scoop out the flesh and add it to the other ingredients.

Spread the remaining tomato pulp into the shells then fill them with the meat mixture. Top with cheese and place under the grill for a few minutes until the cheese has melted. If you find you have too much mixture for the aubergine put it in the freezer and have it with rice another day.

I'm sure you could add any other vegetables you like as long as they're cut small enough.

Easiest pudding EVER! One Crust Fruit Pie.

Ready made short crust pastry.



Roll the pastry into an uneven circle approx 10 inches across the base and paint with egg yolk. Sprinkle the semolina gently over it to stop the fruit juice making the pastry soggy. Using a rolling pin transfer the pastry to a greased baking sheet and simply pile the fruit in the middle. All you do now is turn the edges of the pastry in, is not supposed to look even, the more ragged the better.

Brush the pastry with egg white and sprinkle the sugar over the top. Cook for 35 minutes (gas mark 6, 400For 200C) and serve with ice cream.

RNLI PEMBURY BRANCH

The Royal National Lifeboat Institution this year celebrates 200 years of saving lives at sea. Formed in 1824, the Charity depends upon voluntary donations, fundraising, and gifts in wills to raise the £230mn needed each year to finance the Lifeboat service around our coasts and lifeguards on 240 of our beaches.

A total of 238 Lifeboat stations includes four on the River Thames. There are 5,600 (mainly unpaid) lifeboat crew members, of whom 12% are women.

A current Branch Committee of eight keen volunteers is ably assisted by many others around Pembury and beyond, who are happy to be called upon to assist with our regular events. volunteer lifeboat crews have braved all weather conditions, 24/7, to do everything in their power to save lives at sea and rescue those in distress - without fear or favour, avoiding any prejudgment as to underlying causes. Just about anybody who visits the seaside, goes swimming, or ventures out to sea on a ferry, fishing boat, or pleasure cruise, could - sooner or later - need the help of the Lifeboat service.

REPAIR CAFE

The Tunbridge Wells Repair Café continues to go from strength to strength. If you haven't heard of it, we are a monthly volunteer led group that fixes household items for free. We mend electrical and
