- 24/120. **APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE.** Apologies were received from Cllr Webster. It was **RESOLVED** that the apology and reason be accepted.
- 24/121. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST.** There were no declarations of interest made. Cllr Reilly declared he had been lobbied by a resident about item 24/126a. 24/01578/FULL 11 Greenleas.
- 24/122. **MINUTES.** It was **RESOLVED** that the minutes of the 17 June 2024 be approved and were signed by the Chair as an accurate record.
- 24/123. **CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS.** The Chair announced that proposed changes to Planning legislation would be closely monitored. Until the legislation was available it was not known if there would be an impact on the Pembury Neighbourhood Plan (PNP). Housing targets have been reimposed on Local Authorities, which could have implications on the emerging Local Plan.

Pembury Parish Council were unable to respond due to the lack of detail or measurements submitted within the planning application. However, they do have the following concerns:

- The extension is very large and much bigger than other extensions on neighbouring properties.
- The proposed dwelling is not in keeping with the existing streetscene.
- The proposed dwelling would overshadow neighbouring properties, particularly no. 13.
- There is no mention of energy saving measures as per Policy P4 of the PNP.
- There is no reference to the requirements of PNP policies within the application.

Pembury Parish Council Protocol for future meetings with proposed developers.

January 2024

1. Introduction

1.1. Proposed developers are contacting the Parish Council to arrange meetings with Parish Councillors as part of their Community Engagement.

2. Preparation

- 2.1. Meetings are to be open to all Parish Councillors and one officer.
- 2.2. Parish Councillors are not to meet with developers on their own.
- 2.3. Any conflict of interest must be declared err on the side of caution.

3. Meetings

- 3.1 Meetings are for fact finding and discussion only but no agreement.
- 3.2 Minutes are to be taken and published at the earliest opportunity, so that transparency is evident. Published minutes will not contain any commercially sensitive information.

4. Recommendation to developers

4.1 A recommendation will be made to the developer that a public presentation is held as early as possible.

Guidelines for Pre Application Community Involvement



These guidelines are recommended as good practice that the council expect from all major planning proposals, including Reserved Matters applications, as well as those that are below the major threshold but have significant local impact. They are drawn from BCC's **Statement of Community Involvement Ground Rules.**

They are also informed by the National Planning Policy Framework paragraph 66.

See our Statement of Community involvement for more information - https://www.bristol.gov.uk/planning-and-building-regulations/planning-policy

Applicants will be expected to work closely with those directly affected by their proposals to evolve designs that take account of the views of the community. Proposals that can demonstrate this in developing the design of the new development should be looked on more favourably' and by the 'Before submitting an application' section of the National Planning Practice Guidance - https://www.gov.uk/guidance/before-submitting-an-application.

A key lesson since the Guidelines were introduced in 2008 is that exhibitions and similar events do not by themselves constitute involvement as defined in the Statement of Community Involvement (Oct 2008), but that they can be valuable later in the process to ensure information is taken to the wider community at the end of the involvement process or at application stage.

Step 1: The developer will contact **Bristol Neighbourhood Planning Network (NPN)**administrator (<u>networkadministrator@bristolnpn.net</u>) as early as possible before proposals are fixed and while significant options are still open, giving preliminary details of site location and type of development. The NPN will provide contact details of groups to be involved.

The developer should also contact:

- Local ward councillors
- Bristol City Council Neighbourhood Partnership co-ordinators neighbourhood.partnerships@bristol.gov.uk.

Councillors and Neighbourhood Partnership co-ordinators may also be able to suggest other local groups who should be involved in pre-application engagement.

- Step 2: The developer will arrange to meet representatives of the resident/amenity group where there will be a brief discussion about the site, what existing planning policies are relevant and what issues are important either to the developer or to the community. The Community Involvement procedure will be agreed. The group representative(s) will inform the developer about how they will consult local opinion and to what extent they will need to make the proposals public.
- Step 3: Applicant/developer to prepare early sketches, and present to the group for discussion. This stage may involve several meetings, if the development is large, complicated or contentious. The group will undertake to make a written response within 2 weeks of any meeting with the developer.

If both parties wish to check that their discussions have identified all community issues, an exhibition for the wider public may be mounted. Any questionnaire/ response form must be agreed by both parties. Community responses must be submitted in full with the planning application (with a copy of this information with identifying details redacted for posting on the website), and not summarised in a Community Involvement Statement (CIS).

- Step 4: The developer prepares plans, as far as possible taking account of the consensus view, and presents the plans that they intend to send for planning permission to the resident/amenity group
- Step 5: As a supporting document to the planning application the developer prepares a Community Involvement Statement (CIS) as a record of the Community Involvement process (this is a validation requirement for Major planning applications). A standard form is available on the council's website. The statement will include:
 - points that were made by the community, and
 - changes made by the developer to accommodate these points, and
 - where the developer is unable or unwilling to respond to these points, giving reasons why not.

This record will be agreed and signed by both parties and submitted with the planning application. If no agreement on the document can be reached, then both parties may submit their own statement to the council to be considered along with other information relating to the application.

The following weas discussed:

- The last HIP was reviewed in 2022.
- The village gateway at Hastings Road had stalled due to the high cost of replacement. KCC require their own contractor to undertake the works. It was likely that this area of the village would be redeveloped due to the likely new developments proposed. ACTION: Add to the HIP if this is wanted.
- Road safety around the primary school was the Parish Council's highest priority.
 Corner protection was required at the junction of church Road with Maidstone
 Road, particularly at school drop off and pick up. PPC would be required to
 undertake an informal consultation for highways changes. A copy of a template
 survey letter was included in the Highways Improvement Pack. The informal
 consultation gauges local feelings before progressing to a formal consultation.
 ACTION: PPC to consider undertaking an informal consultation.
- A query into the differences between Pembury Primary School and St James' primary school in Tunbridge Wells was raised.
- A Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) currently cost in the region of £3,000. A TRO would only be progressed once an informal consultation had been undertaken and results submitted to KCC. Significant objections would make it difficult to progress with the works. However, if there were 6 or more objections to a TRO formal consultation then it could go to a KCC Committee for a decision.
- Multiple projects could be added into the TRO to save money.
- PPC should list items on the HIP in priority order with number 1 being the highest priority. **ACTION:** prioritisation to be discussed at the next Committee meeting.
- Priority 2 is the junction of Canterbury Road with Hastings Road. There is very limited visibility when pulling out into Hastings Road and is very dangerous.
- The other end of Canterbury Road junction with Henwood Green Road was raised.
 The problem related to parking from the new development (Oast Gardens)
 obstructing buses and dust lorries. ACTION: This could be added to the HIP and
 a priority given. It could be added to the TRO work at the same time as the other
 items.

- Making parts of Henwood Green Road one way was discussed and there were
 concerns about parking causing problems for buses and dust carts to get through.
 A previous informal public consultation showed strong objections to the proposal,
 but a new consultation could be considered. This would require investigation by
 the Public Transport team as it would impact on local bus routes.
- Project Funding was discussed. Elsewhere Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding was used but Tunbridge Wells Borough Council had not introduced this. CIL money is used to fund lots of schemes included on other HIPs. The Community Engagement Officer had a small budget for the whole of Kent small projects. Additional funding could be obtained from Member's Grants. KCC will prepare design documents and report on likely costs of proposed works.
- Funding through TWBC was raised. Cllr Birch reported that she is investigating funds earmarked for street improvements and traffic measures and would report back when the officer involved returned from their holiday.
- Information on Kippings Cross and the Pembury corridor Review was raised.
- Woodgate Corner yellow box junction. The Intelligent Traffic System Team can review the area, as per our HIP. PPC were encouraged to speak to the police about any issues they know about and to report PPCs finding. KCC will be rolling out some enforcement over the coming months with cameras on busy junctions. It was felt that Pembury should be a priority as this was a busy junction, near a hospital. This was already on the HIP. ACTION: PPC to liaise with the local police.

Extract of email from resident

Regarding Tonbridge Road from the hospital up to the Woodsgate traffic lights.

I have noticed more and more cars overtaking outside the lane in order to get up to the lights when turning right out of the lane to turn right cars zoom up on the hatched part overtaking the cars. Equally when turning into right my lane just beyond the hotel from the lights direction you are sometimes met with cars face to face that have come up! Do I wondered if a narrow or something could be put in front of the road marking warning cars to stay in their lane.
